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Requirement 2b1 for First Aid - PREREQUISITE

Using checklists provided in the First Aid Merit Badge pamphlet or ones approved by your counselor, do the following:

1. Assemble a personal first-aid kit for hiking and backpacking. Demonstrate the proper use of each item in your first-aid kit to your counselor.

Troops may have different items they require for a scout backpacking and hiking first aid kit.

Personal First Aid Kit

Adhesive bandages: In assorted sizes, including finger bandages.

Sterile gauze pads: For covering wounds.

Adhesive tape: For securing dressings.

Moleskin or blister pads: Blister prevention

Antiseptic wipes or alcohol wipes: For cleaning wounds.

Antibacterial ointment: To help prevent infection.

Pain relievers: Such as ibuprofen or acetaminophen for minor aches.

Antihistamine: For allergic reactions or insect bites.

Insect bite cream (Benadryl or hydrocortisone): Use for insect bites or mild skin irritations.

Personal Medications: any prescriptions or EpiPen

Personal products: Female scouts

Hand sanitizer packets: For quick hand hygiene when soap and water are unavailable.

CPR mask: For providing mouth-to-mouth resuscitation.

<u>Gloves (latex-free):</u> For handling bodily fluids.

<u>Tweezers:</u> For removing splinters or ticks.

Scissors: For cutting gauze or other materials.

<u>Medical tape:</u> For securing bandages and dressings

<u>Elastic Bandage</u>: Wrap sprains or strains to provide support and reduce swelling.

Triangular Bandage: Create slings or support for an injured arm or shoulder.

<u>Thermal Blanket:</u> Keep an injured person warm to help prevent shock.

<u>First-Aid Manual or Cheat Sheet:</u> A small guide provides quick instructions in an emergency.
